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| Cleanliness | Trash and Recycling Containers | Staff Evaluation | \$175,000 allocated for capital procurement of waste stations to expand coverage and introduce. Staff evaluation of container types completed, Public input period through October. Order placement in November. Receive containers by end of calendar year. Install in Feb/March 2014. |
| | Street Sweeping | | Street sweeping occurs nightly in downtown. The schedule rotates and is done more frequently in the center of downtown. Attached is a schedule for downtown cleanliness indicating the schedule for each street. |
| | Sidewalk cleaning, (cigarette butts and dog poop) | Staff is working to develop the policy through community outreach, and guidance from the community for what parameters to set on the sidewalk pressure washing. | \$150,000 is in a CIP infrastructure line this FY for "Downtown Clean and Green Initiative". We are still developing the policy through community outreach, and specifically need guidance from the community for what parameters to set on the sidewalk pressure washing. We had hoped to be significantly farther along with developing a contract for this; however, the project manager that would have handled this project was reassigned to slide repair. |
| | Demolition of the Handy Park and Flying Frog building | | The demolition of the Handy Park and Flying Frog is scheduled to occur in February to March of 2014. The demolition contract is being prepared. The building contains some hazardous materials that must be abated. |
| | Graffiti | | The Public Works Department utilizes nuisance court assignees to remove graffiti on public property. Requiring property owners to remove graffiti on their property would require an ordinance. |

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| Safety | Transients | Enforcement of City laws and ordinances | Most have moved on this time of year, highest numbers are May-August. The large influx of transients in the CBD has contributed to the increase in criminal activity the area is experiencing. Downtown Unit Officers are regularly meeting with the City Homeless Coordinator and other homeless service providers to provide the transient population information that will assist them in their current situation. DTU Officers have created an informational pamphlet to educate the community on the most commonly violated criminal offenses in the CBD, in an effort to deter potential criminal activity. APD has also increased DTU staffing to create a consistent and visible presence in the CBD. |
| | Panhandling | ordinance enforced through citation and arrest for anyone panhandling, regardless of housing status. | Many of the individuals panhandling are not homeless, though a small number are individuals who do consistently seek homeless services. Outreach workers intensify efforts to engage repeat offenders if they are homeless. |
| | Drug Activity in the Park | Enforcement of City laws and ordinances | Downtown Unit (DTU) Officers have coordinated a number of special operations in and around Pritchard Park to curb illegal drug sales and use. There have been at least 7 arrests made for sale, delivery and possession of controlled substances. This effort is ongoing. |
| | Topless Women | Currently there is no City Ordinance or State Statute that makes it illegal to be topless in public | The proposed legislative change that would have addressed this situation was not approved in the last legislative session. Downtown Unit Officers continue to respond to complaints of topless women and attempt to educate the public and concerned parties about the situation and lack of enforcement capability. |
